Pet movements

Ireland Great Britain



- no change to GB rules
- EU pet passport
- Rabies vaccination
- Microchip
- Derogation for more than 5 pets taking part in a event/registered with an association organising events

Great Britain - Ireland

X Pet passports issued in GB will not be valid from 1st January

- EU pet passport, issued in an EU country or Northern Ireland
- Health cert issued by an Official Vet in GB
- Treatment against *Echinococcus multilocularis* (tapeworm)
- Enter Ireland through a Travellers' Point of Entry (Dublin/Rosslare/Cork Ports; Dublin/Shannon/Cork Airports
- Provide advance notice
- Derogation for more than 5 pets taking part in a event/registered with an association organising events

Commercial movements (IE-GB)





- Advance notification by UK agent on IPAFFS at least one working day before the expected time of arrival at the point of entry
 This generates a UNN number
- Fill in Part 1 of the health cert on TRACES, submit to RVO to complete the cert
- Give the RVO the UNN number to be added to the health cert
- Email copy of signed health cert to UK agent, to be submitted by them to IPAFFS
- EU pet passport
- Rabies vaccination
- Microchip
- Echinococcus treatment is <u>not</u> necessary for dogs entering GB from Ireland





Ireland Great Britain

To transport live animals transporters will need to apply for a GB-issued:

- transporter authorisation
- certificate of competence
- vehicle approval certificate

January - 30th June

- identity and physical checks at destination or other approved premises based on assessments of biosecurity and public health risks
- Entry to GB through any port

From 1st July

- entry to GB via a Border Control Post (BCP)
- identity and physical checks at BCP

Great Britain Ireland

- X Pet passports issued in GB will not be valid from 1st January
- EU pet passport, issued in an EU country or Northern Ireland


☐ Make sure your transporter or haulier is in possession of the required EU authorisations.


□ Ensure pre-notification of imports of live animals and animal products are submitted at least 24 hours before the consignment arrives at the point of entry.


☐ The person responsible for importing the consignment is also required to submit copies of the relevant health certificates and any other documentation required by EU legislation to an electronic mailbox at the same time as the TRACES document is completed.
